**SECTION 4: First aid measures**

**4.1 Description of first aid measures**

**General information**

### 7.1 Precautions for safe handling

**Advice on safe handling**

Due to the organic solvents' content of the mixture: Prevent the creation of flammable or explosive concentrations of vapour in air and avoid vapour concentration higher than the occupational exposure limits. The product should only be used in areas from which all naked lights and other sources of ignition have been excluded. Avoid the inhalation of dust, particulates and spray mist arising from the application of this mixture. Dry sanding, flame cutting and/or welding of the dry paint film may give rise to dust and/or hazardous fumes. Wet [sanding]/[flattening] should be used wherever possible. Avoid inhalation of dust from sanding. For personal protection see section 8.

**General protective and hygiene measures**

Avoid skin and eye contact. Do not eat or drink during work - no smoking. Wash hands before breaks and after work. Clean skin thoroughly after work; apply skin cream.

**Advice on protection against fire and explosion**

Isolate from sources of heat, sparks and open flame. No sparking tools should be used. Electrical equipment should be protected to the appropriate standard. Vapours are heavier than air and may spread along floors. Vapours may form explosive mixtures with air.

Comply with legal health and safety regulations; Prevent unauthorised access. Keep container tightly closed and dry in a cool, well-ventilated place. Protect from heat and direct sunlight. Keep away from sources of ignition. No smoking.

Always keep in containers of same material as the original one. Never use pressure to empty: container is not a pressure vessel. Containers which are opened must be carefully resealed and kept upright to prevent leakage. Keep container tightly closed. Observe label precautions.

If workers are exposed to concentrations above the exposure limit they must use appropriate, certified respirators. When operators, whether spraying or not, have to work inside the spray booth, ventilation is unlikely to be sufficient to control particulates and solvent vapour in all cases. In such circumstances they should wear a compressed air-fed respirator during the spraying process and until such time as the particulates and solvent vapour concentration has fallen below the exposure limits. Sufficient protection is given wearing suitable protective gloves checked according to i.e. EN 374, in the event of risk of skin contact with the product. Exposure to component solvents vapours concentration in excess of the stated occupational exposure limit may result in adverse health effects such as mucous membrane and respiratory system irritation and adverse effects on kidney,

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liver and central nervous system. Symptoms and signs include headache, dizziness, fatigue, muscular weakness, drowsiness and in extreme cases, loss of consciousness.
